

I Hate Zombies By Shantnu Tiwari I Hate Zombies

Zombies have a way of interrupting your day and life in a most inconvenient manner making it easy to declare a universal opinion of dislike as in I Hate Zombies by Shantnu Tiwari. Blue and his best friend Shake hate zombies for a variety of good reasons: zombies killed their friends kidnapped Blue's mom and killed their pizza delivery guy ruining their pizza and their chances of getting a refund. Written in a style that is accessible and conversational the retrospective telling of the story with Blue and Shake writing what took place was reminiscent of various movies that frame themselves using in media res; however the writing itself could benefit from some further refinement as there were a lot of repetition and tangents. Though a relatively quick read with plenty of pop culture references (they killed Kenny!) and fairly mindlessly entertaining premise as a whole there were portions that were frustratingly bro-y and problematic including Blue lamenting his lack of a girlfriend and the boys talking frequently about hot girls (or lack thereof) in their town making it difficult to enjoy the various potentially intriguing premises that never quite came together cohesively. It often feels like the author makes a mistake and instead of fixing the mistake just incorporates it into the story which is humorous sometimes (Dark Lard) but doesn't really add to the story and just continues the rambling nature of the book. - Missing words- this thing needs so much editing So while there were many fascinating concepts (zombies aliens government conspiracies time loops talking dogs) there were few real connections or explanations regarding the topics making the story feel random and lazy, They are pot smoking losers out to save the world from zombies/aliens! I love when authors throws in some laughs when I'm reading about zombies: Nazis and zombies! Shantnu Tiwari I got this as a free e-book and given that I am intrigued by zombies I thought I'd give it a try: So instead of writing a rambling review I am just going to list (some of) the reasons I did not like this book. My friends and I used to write (horrible) Harry Potter fan fiction together where we'd take turn writing scenes where we incorporated ourselves into the stories. This reads like that but ten times worse because the narrators are meant to be adults yet act and think like two high children, I'm just going to leave this quote here and let you make of it what you will: I saw him look up with a look that looked like he had made up his mind. Also there's this annoying bias that no one who does not fit the main characters' standards of attractiveness should have sex or be sexual. Women are treated as sex object and though the characters recognize this they do nothing to change their thinking, -Annoying logic that hot girls are mean and rude because they never show interest in the main character: The narrator is often aware that he is rambling but still continues to ramble. The only thing worse than a narrator that rambles is a narrator who knows he rambles and doesn't do anything about it: - Weird (sexualized) violence and torture scenes that didn't really serve a purpose and seemed unnecessary: There are a lot of flashback stories intermixed in the main story

as well all commentary and ramblings from the narrators, Also the book could really use some editing to minimize the rambling narrative unnecessary commentary missing words and repetitiveness. And don't even get me started on the weird misogynistic elements of the book, I did not enjoy this book and considered abandoning it multiple times: But I don't like rating/reviewing books unless I finish them so there you go: Shantnu Tiwari The plot of this book was a great idea but the writing leaves something to be desired: The book tends to ramble between some supreme being controlling zombies to two stoner type heroes to corrupt politicians and to parallel dimensions and it does get confusing sometimes[1]
